

Bushey Gan Uniform & Dress Code

<u>Boys</u>	<u>Girls</u>
Sweatshirt or Tee-shirt with Gan logo	Sweatshirt or Tee-shirt with Gan logo
Navy jogging bottoms	Navy jogging bottoms or navy leggings
In summer boys may wear navy shorts with an elastic waist	In summer girls may wear navy shorts with an elastic waist or short leggings
Blue school kippah (only available from school office)	Girls may wear a pretty skirt on Fridays for Oneg Shabbat (Shabbat Party).
Tzitzit if boys are dry (available from school office or Divrei Kodesh shop)	Long hair must be tied back at all times
Velcro shoes	Velcro shoes

Children should have spare clothes, clearly named in their school bag. Please wash and return any spare clothes that may be used for your child.

Footwear

Children should wear Velcro shoes to promote independence.

Please do not put your child in converses.

In summer

Children should not wear crocs, open-toe or backless sandals for safety reasons.

Socks should be worn at all times.

Please provide a sun hat.

In winter

Boots or wellingtons are not healthy to wear all morning. Please have a pair of shoes to change your child into when you arrive.

Mittens should be strung through coats or glove pegs may be used.

ALL UNIFORM, COATS, HATS AND MITTENS MUST BE CLEARLY NAMED.

Any un-named items will be put in the foyer for parents to identify.

Fake Tattoos

We do not feel it appropriate for children attending a United Synagogue nursery school to wear fake tattoos.

Jewellery

For safety reasons, children should not wear jewellery at Gan. Girls with pierced ears may wear plain studs.

Parent Dress Code

Please respect the Gan's Dress Code.

- Men should have their heads covered.
- Ladies should wear appropriate clothing for entering shul premises including covering shoulders. Skirts should be worn when attending Oneg Shabbat, celebrating Chagim and when helping in the Gan.
